SECTION I VEGETABLES AND FRUIT (Open)

- 1 A collection (24" X 24"max.) of four kinds of vegetables, one of each kind. Each item to be marked out of 10 points
- 2 Four potatoes, one variety
- 3 Twelve shallots (excluding pickling)
- 4 A vase of five stems of mixed culinary herbs
- 5 Three carrots
- 6 Six runner beans
- 7 Garlic, three bulbs
- 8 Three onions 8 oz or under
- 9 Three onions over 8 oz
- 10 Three leeks
- 11 Three beetroots
- 12 A plate of three tomatoes (with calyx)
- 13 A plate of six tomatoes (miniature variety with calyx)
- 14 Any vegetable not mentioned above, number optional
- 15 A plate of three dessert apples
- 16 A plate of three cooking apples
- 17 A plate of any fruit other than apples
- 18 Heaviest Marrow
- 19 Two Squashes

SECTION II FLOWERS AND POT PLANTS (Open)

- 20 Sunflower with the largest diameter head
- 21 A specimen bloom chrysanthemum
- 22 A vase of three disbudded chrysanthemums
- 23 One stem of spray chrysanthemum
- 24 A vase of three stems of spray chrysanthemums. Any variety or varieties.
- 25 A vase of hardy perennials, max. 9 stems, one or more kinds
- 26 One dahlia over 200mm diameter (giant or large)
- 27 Three dahlias between 150mm & 220mm diameter (medium), one or more varieties
- 28 Three decorative or ball dahlias up to 170mm diameter (small or miniature), one or more varieties
- 29 Three cactus/semi cactus dahlias up to 170mm diameter (small or miniature), one or more varieties
- 30 Three pompon dahlias up to 52mm, one or more varieties
- 31 Three dahlias, any other group not mentioned in classes 26-30
- 32 A display of mixed dahlias
- 33 A rose bloom, large flowered

- 34 A vase of three stems of large flowered roses, one or more varieties
- 35 Floribunda rose, one stem
- 36 A vase of any kind of flower not mentioned above, not more than nine stems
- 37 A vase of mixed garden flowers
- 38 A vase of foliage and/or berries/seedheads
- 39 A cactus or succulent
- 40 A pot plant in flower *
- 41 A pot plant, foliage *
- 42 A pot plant in fruit *
**(internal diameter of pot not to exceed 8")*

SECTION III FLORAL ART (Open)

- 43 "Hidden Treasure"—a miniature exhibit not exceeding 4" overall, open staging.
- 44 "Red Hot" an exhibit of natural plant material, accessories allowed, to be staged in a niche, 24" wide, height unlimited.
- 45 "Colours of Autumn". Exhibit to be staged in a niche, 24" wide, 36" high.

SECTION IV PHOTOGRAPHY (Open)

Taken by the exhibitor, the exhibit not previously to have won a prize at one of the Society's shows. Unmounted, with or without border, max. size 7" x 5" colour, except class 50 which is up to A4 size.

SECTION V HOME FARE (Open)

- 51 Gingerbread, four pieces

- 54 Six Jam tarts
(short crust pastry)
- 55 A loaf of teabread (fruit to have been soaked in tea)
- 56 A pot of fruit or savoury jelly
